## Alaskans Agree:

Labor, Native Communities, and Businesses Want Offshore Areas Open for Safe Development

































Fifteen statewide Alaskan organizations — from labor unions, native corporations, and businesses — wrote to the Obama administration this month urging the Bureau of Ocean Energy Management to retain future leases for safe development in the Arctic and the Cook Inlet.

Today, 72% of Alaskans support responsible and environmentally safe offshore development of the Outer Continental Shelf (OCS).¹ Alaska has benefited for generations from responsible development and environmental stewardship.

Alaska's Arctic OCS will constitute the eighth largest oil resource in the world. Denying Alaska and America
of these resources would further increase our reliance of foreign energy sources in a geopolitically volatile
environment.
