









Employment Fallen For Two Years And Continues Into Third But Moderating




Unemployment Rates, Alaska and U.S. January 2012 to September 2018

INDUSTRIES HARDEST-HIT BY STATE RECESSION, 2015 AND 2017










Alaska Oil Industry Employment Stabilizes

Number of cruise ship passengers in AK





Uniformed military in AK




Mining Employment Very Stable In Alaska





Fishing Employment In AK Has Remained Positive




Alaska's Timber Industry Employment
Continues Drops Some




Home Prices Have Changed Little

Price of Single Family Homes, Alaska




Home Sales In Alaska Have Changed Little

Statewide home sales, MLS




No Sign Of An Increase In Foreclosures In Alaska




Not Much Change For The Number Of New Housing Units Being Built In AK


Residential Vacancy Rates Are Trending Upwards Some









Anchorage-and Urban Alaska CPI-U





Alaska's Population Fell Slightly In 2017-Lost Less Than Half Of A Percent (Just 23,000 larger than Seattle)




The details. In 2017, there were 10,786 births minus 4,530 deaths, plus net migration of -8,885 that leads to a total population loss of 2,629.


AK has largest migration flows in U.S.
