








What does Initiative do?

Quotes from Attorney General Opinion, Oct. 14, 2019

"Despite the seemingly simple and straightforward title of the initiative bill, the language of the bill is difficult to interpret and raises a number of implementation and constitutional questions."

"It is also likely to lead to litigation over the meaning of various provisions and questions of equal protection, due process, and the delegation of authority to Department of Revenue."



What are others saying?

Quotes from Roger Marks, Retired State Economist, Oct. 14, 2019

"That is the problem with ballot initiatives. They are statutes drafted by a small number of like-minded sponsors. If passed, the Legislature cannot touch them for two years. It's a "take-it-or-leave-it" lawmaking without the balanced review good legislation needs."

"The initiative sponsors have not stated what is fair, how they justify it, how they measure it or how the initiative attains fairness. They better have some basis, because economically it is a mess."
